Here is our latest newsletter, giving you all the latest updates on how our project is developing. Before that, though, we would like to announce that **our next online roundtable will take place on the 8th of July at 1300** GMT for 2 hours. The roundtable will discuss the issues surrounding the November UN Conference on the zone. Much has been written about how Israel and the United States will not turn up and what the challenges are, but there is still everything to play for, and we have waited many years for this conference.

OK, so now for news. Firstly, many of us in the project and our supporters were in New York in May during the days of the NPT Prepcom and we were able to have an excellent panel, hosted by the Irish MFA, which you can read about here. We were delighted that Jordan's Ambassador Sima Sami Bahous attended as she will be chairing the November UN conference on the subject of the Middle East Zone. We were also delighted to be able to distribute the latest version of the Draft Treaty (included in this e-mail), and we welcome any and all comments and suggestions.

Since the NPT Prepcom, we have been working on rolling out a new and vital aspect of our project, namely our education programme. After several of our project's core members participated in meetings in Cyprus in April, it became apparent that there is a great need to build capacity by working with students from the region, especially female students, interested in international relationships in the Middle East. To this end we are currently working on a series of workshops that will be delivered later on this year. An urgent priority for the project now is to secure funds to enable at least two members of the core team to work on the project full time. We are therefore going through a phase of research into possible funders and the subsequent application process.
